JESUS UNCENSORED by Dr. Brian Powell

One of the most common phrases we hear today is, "I believe in God, but not religion." This type of statement indicates that religion hasn't been offering God in a way that people can sit down at the spiritual table and feast. It means that God hasn't been presented, well, as God.

We like to wrap God up in all kinds of boxes. We make him neat, tidy, safe, and secure. We come up with trite little feel-good phrases like: "God never closes a door without opening a window" or "God only helps those who help themselves," neither of which is in the Bible.

People today desperately need God raw and unfiltered, a far cry from the stained-glass window depictions of Jesus many of us have grown accustomed to. People need a God that can be seen, felt, and experienced in their daily lives. We don't need Jesus all dressed up in spiritual buzz talk, catchphrases, and religious clichés.

People don't need a bunch of God-talk; they need God to talk. And if it's messy, it's messy. If it's hard, let it be hard. If it doesn't fit into three points and a poem and doesn't end in a way that makes the rest of the day comfortable, so be it. If it flies in the face of culture, religion, and politics, let it rip. We may not understand it all, but that's okay. We may not even like it all, but at least we'll know. I've never met anyone who didn't want things served up without spin, particularly spiritual things.

I love Matthew's description of the people's response to Jesus in chapter 7: "When Jesus had finished saying these things, the crowds were amazed at his teaching, because he taught as one who had authority, and not as their teachers of the law" (Matthew 7:28-29). People were amazed—real people. He doesn't say religious people. No, he's referring to ordinary people like you and me.

They were amazed, meaning they expected the same old religious song and dance. They thought they'd heard it all. They knew about Adam and Eve, Father Abraham, Noah's Ark, Moses and the Prophets, Oprah and Dr. Phil. But then came Jesus, and they were astonished, not just at what he said, but how he said it.

Are you amazed by Jesus?

If not, you aren't experiencing him as much more than words on a page. Reading the Bible without understanding the personality of Jesus is like watching a movie with the sound on mute. Intimacy with Jesus is the only way to live in wonder and amazement of who he really is. Everything else in life flows out of one's growing knowledge and personal relationship with him.

Let me ask: Do you think the enemy of our soul will let that happen without a fight? Satan has a master's degree in deception. The deceiver deceives through distortion; he loves to filter God's real identity, which includes distorting Jesus's personality.


Remember, Jesus is the complete revelation of God. He is the defining word on what the heart of God is truly like, what God is up to in the world, and what God wants to do in our lives. That's why a deep knowledge of who Jesus is must remain the number one pursuit of our lives.

Sadly, religion and culture often misrepresent Jesus on a large scale, and millions fall for it. The truth is knowing about Jesus and knowing him personally are not the same. To know him as he truly is is what it means to come home. And nothing compares to the life, love, joy, and peace this kind of relationship brings to the human experience.

A deep knowledge of Jesus is humanity's greatest need; to be mistaken about him is life's saddest tragedy. In the new year, I pray that you will draw closer to Christ than ever, which means getting to know him as he really is.

Since coming to the KY District in 2016, I noticed that the Church of the Nazarene had no presence at all between Florence and northeast Louisville. That is an area of 88 miles on I-71, that includes at least three large towns: Carrolton, LaGrange, and Crestwood. This is still a huge concern for me, please pray that God will open the doors for us to step into this area of need.

I noticed that we had a similar situation on I-75, between Florence and Georgetown. This area has several more towns not being reached. I also discovered that many churches from various denominations were closing. This area is 58 miles, and has towns like Walton, Verona, Crittenden, Dry Ridge, Corinth, Williamstown, and Sadieville.

Praise be to God, on November 2, 2023, with the support of Georgetown Church, and the hospitality of Bean's Café & Bakery, Pastor Tony & Linda Hayse started a new congregation in Dry Ridge. This group meets on Thursdays right now until they grow enough to need a different facility. Please pray for New Life Church of the Nazarene in Dry Ridge!
