## The Wellspring by Dr. Brian Powell

Everything is easier when I'm functioning out of the wellspring of God's provision. In this place, I'm a better husband, a better dad, a better friend, a better leader, a better pastor, a better preacher, and better at everything (except golf). Regrettably, stepping into the wellspring requires something that we have less of today than we did yesterday: TIME.

With the pressures of juggling a family, ministry, career, and Lord only knows what else, it's easy to neglect spending time with Jesus. When that happens, we grow weary and frustrated and start feeling like we need a break.



One thing I wish I would've learned as a young adult is that following Jesus requires that we SLOW DOWN. Dallas Willard said, "Hurry is the great enemy of spiritual life in our day. You must ruthlessly eliminate hurry from your life."

Remember that Satan doesn't show up with horns and a pitchfork trying to scare us. He's not an imaginary monster hiding under the bed. Pop culture has taught us to think about the devil as if he were a cartoon character. However, he's far too intelligent and strategic to approach us in some nonsensical way.

In reality, we're more likely to run into the devil in the form of a message on our phone, binge-watching our favorite shows, or scrolling social media for hours. Living in a pleasure-driven society has produced a generation of dopamine addicts, which is why people's faces stay planted on their phones. By design, many things that demand our attention today rob us of our most valuable commodity; again, I'm speaking of time.

What do people usually say when you ask, "How are you?" "Oh, I'm good—just busy." Unfortunately, people are too busy to live spiritually vibrant lives. The result is that their family suffers, their ministry suffers, and ultimately, they suffer.

Keep in mind that there is a healthy kind of busyness where life is full of things that matter, not wasted on trivial pursuits. By that definition, Jesus Himself was busy. So, the problem isn't when you have a lot to do. It's when you have too much to do, and the only way to keep up is to hurry.

Guess what else is painfully time-consuming? LOVE. Jesus said the greatest command is to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength," followed only by "love your neighbor as yourself."

My relationships with my wife, kids, family, and long-term friends are only good because I've invested time in loving these people. On the other hand, my worst moments as a father, husband, pastor, and even human being, happen when I'm in a hurry to too busy to pay attention—e.g., late for an appointment, behind on a deadline, trying to cram too much into a single day.

Anxiety, pressure, impatience, complaining, irritability, saying things you'll regret, and other repercussions are the fruit of hurry and busyness. If you don't believe me, next time you're running late and trying to get your spouse and kids out of the house, pay attention to how you relate to them. Does it look like love? Or does it feel more like annoyance?

In our culture, SLOW is viewed negatively. When a restaurant has bad service, we call it slow. When a movie is boring, we complain that it's slow. The message is clear: slow is bad; fast is good. Yet, the Kingdom's value system teaches the opposite: hurry is of the devil, and slow is the way of Jesus.

God knows something about us that we have yet to learn: No one loves well in a hurry. So, slow down. Rest in His presence. Talk to Him. Listen for His voice. Linger in the wellspring. Abide in the place where life and ministry feel less like work and more like victory. It really is the essence of freedom!

### **Life Long Learning**

We have been journeying through the summer months and something that I always enjoy in the summer is the game of baseball. For many of you reading this, that is not a surprise at all, as you have probably heard me talk about baseball (especially the Phillies) or you have seen me wearing a red, Phillies ballcap. My earliest childhood memories involve watching or playing the game of baseball and it continues to be a favorite activity to engage and enjoy for me. Throughout my life I have come to learn more about the game of baseball and had opportunity to experience different aspects (from going to new ballparks to reading about the lives of those who have played the game). Learning more about the game of baseball recalls a quote from the poet/writer Maya Angelou, who once said: "I've learned that you shouldn't go through life with a catcher's mitt on both hands; you need to be able to throw some things back."

The whole purpose of a catcher's mitt is to be able to catch what is coming down the plate, even if it has some heat/velocity with it. Life certainly throws many things at us, and we would probably like to wear two catcher's mitts to try our best to not be caught off guard and at the very least to take in all that comes our way, though not everything that comes our way is helpful nor something we should hold onto. As we go through life, we receive many things along the way, but we must also learn what is worth keeping and what is not. For those leading and guiding congregations, learning what to keep and take in and what to throw back is crucial (not only for the minister but to those in their care). There is a dangerous trap that a minister can fall into and that is where the pursuit of learning is lost and set aside. This trap becomes a reality for a minister, due to a variety of reasons, but it will eventually have devastating effect.

Simply, putting our mitt down and not catching what we can learn (reading, seminars, classes, etc.) will diminish our effectiveness and ability to minister to others. Ministering to others must involve continual learning to grow in biblical understanding, theological reflection, life together with others, and practical ways of sharing the Gospel. Fellow ministers and leaders I encourage you to read a variety of books relating to ministry, attending seminars, taking various classes, and having conversation with others over faith and life. As an ordained minister in the Church of the Nazarene, one is required to compile a minimum of twenty hours of lifelong learning. There is a helpful tool to track one's hours and figure out what constitutes lifelong learning hours. It is the Lifelong Learning Registry (<a href="https://learning.nazarene.org/">https://learning.nazarene.org/</a>). I would encourage all ministers to register and utilize this tool as you make your way through each year of ministry to track what you read and have had opportunity to learn from.

Each one of us are given a set innings to minister to others. Let's be sure we have our mitt on to catch learning but to also know what is worth keeping and sharing with others to grow with God and one another.


We have also spent the past few years working with our adult leaders and getting them involved in sharing their stories. Stories of being made whole, and how God has healed their bodies, minds, and souls.

## The Breaking Before The Blessing

In the work of church revitalization, one must arrive at the point of brokenness. It is in this place of passion and desperation that God strengthens us for the hard seasons. It is a lonely and difficult task, but if you allow God to break you, He will use you in amazing ways. Be honest with God. Allow Him to work in your life so that the church body can be transformed.

There are few things more difficult than facing up to our brokenness. It is much easier to ignore the cracks in our foundation, to try and sweep them under the rug and pretend they don't exist. However, to grow as a person, it is essential that we come to terms with our brokenness. This is what Jacob did when he wrestled with the Angel of God. He was broken physically, but also emotionally. It was through this process that he was finally able to receive the blessing of God.

All leaders, like Jacob, must wrestle with God in order to receive his blessing. Brokenness is part of the process of being made whole. So, if you are feeling broken right now, know that it is only a prelude to the blessing that is to come. Embrace the process and allow God to work in your life. You will be so much better for it in the end.

Jacob was alone with God. All distractions had been removed. He was in a place of total vulnerability. And it was there that he received his blessing. In the same way, you must spend time alone with God. This means making space in your schedule to read His Word and reflect on His will for your life. It means being honest about the areas in which you are struggling and asking for His help. Remember, the most effective leaders make time alone with God a priority.

Jacob was broken by God. As a result, he was able to receive the blessing of God. Brokenness before the Lord is the pathway to His divine blessing. So, if you are feeling broken right now, know that you are in good company. And know that God will use you in amazing ways as you surrender your life to Him.

It is only when we come to the end of ourselves that we can begin to understand the power of God. When we are willing to be broken and changed by Him, we will be used in ways we never could have imagined. So, if you're presently broken, know that it's just the start of something greater. God has so much more in store for you.

All of these materials can be found at <a href="https://www.thefoundrypublishing.com">www.thefoundrypublishing.com</a> You can also order posters and T-Shirts, but it is not required.
- 3. Quizzing Breakdown:
  - a. It is designed for kids 1st-6th grade
  - b. Quizzing is a 6 year program.
    - i. 1&2 Samuel (2022-23)
    - ii. Matthew (2023-24)
    - iii. Acts (2024-25)
    - iv. Genesis (2025-26)
    - v. Exodus (2026-27)
    - vi. Joshua, Judges, Ruth (2027-28)
  - c. Each book will be divided into Dig Sites. A Dig Site is how they break up the book of the Bible into small parts for studying.
  - d. Quizzing is divided into two levels. Red (beginners) Blue (advanced)
  - e. There will be four quiz matches each year. The final quiz match will qualify the quizzer for the World Quiz match which happens at General Assembly June 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023.
